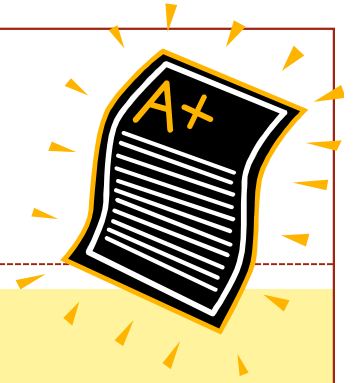


# ELA 6 CCSS Curriculum
